Tarbiyah Curriculum Outline

This Tarbiyah curriculum is designed to cultivate love, reverence, and understanding of the Prophets (AS). Through structured, age-appropriate storytelling and reflection, students will gain insight into the character, struggles, and missions of the Prophets, starting with Adam (AS) and continuing through the lives of major prophets mentioned in the Qur'an. The curriculum aims to build a strong foundation in tawheed, moral character, sabr (patience), and reliance upon Allah. It encourages students to internalize the values of sincerity, humility, justice, compassion, and submission to divine guidance—virtues exemplified by the Prophets. Each lesson is connected to clear Qur'anic verses, fostering not only spiritual development but also Qur'anic literacy. As students progress, they will learn not only facts about the Prophets but will reflect on the relevance of their stories to their own lives and responsibilities as Muslims today.

Adam AS 1	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Understand that Adam was the first human created by Allah from clay. • Recognize Allah's power, creativity, and wisdom in creation. • Learn that Adam was given special knowledge, making him unique. • Appreciate that knowledge is a gift from Allah and should be used responsibly. • Reflect on the importance of humility and the dangers of arrogance. 	<p>Key Content and Sources:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Allah created Adam from clay: <i>"Indeed, We created man from sounding clay, from molded mud."</i> (Quran 15:26) • Allah commanded the angels to bow to Adam; Iblis refused due to arrogance: <i>"And [mention] when We said to the angels, 'Prostrate before Adam'; so they prostrated, except for Iblis..."</i> (Quran 2:34) • Allah taught Adam the names of all things, showing his unique capacity for knowledge: <i>"And He taught Adam the names – all of them..."</i> (Quran 2:31) • Knowledge is a blessing from Allah that helps humans fulfill their role on Earth.
Adam AS 2	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn about Adam and Hawwa's life in Jannah and the test they faced. • Understand Shaytan's role in misleading them. • Recognize that humans can make mistakes but must strive to seek forgiveness. • Appreciate Allah's mercy and His readiness to forgive sincere repentance. 	<p>Key Content and Sources:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Adam and Hawwa were told not to eat from the forbidden tree: <i>"O Adam, dwell, you and your wife, in Paradise... But do not approach this tree..."</i> (Quran 2:35) • Shaytan caused them to slip, leading to their removal from Jannah: <i>"But Satan caused them to slip out of it..."</i> (Quran 2:36) • Adam repented, and Allah forgave him: <i>"Then Adam received from his Lord [some] words, and He accepted his repentance..."</i> (Quran 2:37) • Allah is the Most Merciful and loves those who seek forgiveness and strive to do better.
Idris AS	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn about Prophet Idris (AS) as a prophet and his special qualities. • Understand that he was a wise, patient, and pious man who loved to worship Allah. • Reflect on the importance of knowledge, worship, and good deeds. 	<p>Key Content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Prophet Idris (AS) was a prophet mentioned in the Quran as truthful and noble. • Quranic reference: <i>"And mention in the Book, Idris. Indeed, he was a man of truth and a prophet. And We raised him to a high station."</i> (Quran 19:56–57) • Idris (AS) was known for his wisdom, patience, and devotion to Allah.

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Some traditions explain that he encouraged his people to worship Allah, perform good deeds, and avoid wrongdoing.
Nuh AS	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Learn about Prophet Nuh (AS) and his message to his people. Understand his patience and dedication in calling his people to worship Allah alone. Reflect on the consequences of disobedience and the importance of trusting Allah. 	<p>Key Content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Nuh (AS) was sent to a disobedient people who worshipped idols. He spent 950 years calling them to Allah. Quranic reference: <i>"Indeed, We sent Nuh to his people, [saying], 'Warn your people before there comes to them a painful punishment.'"</i> (Quran 71:1) Most of his people rejected him, but he continued to be patient. Allah commanded Nuh (AS) to build an ark. Quranic reference: <i>"And construct the ship under Our observation and Our inspiration and do not address Me concerning those who have wronged; indeed, they are [to be] drowned."</i> (Quran 11:37)
Hud AS	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Learn about Prophet Hud (AS) and the people of 'Ad. Understand how Hud called his people to worship Allah and abandon pride. Reflect on the dangers of arrogance and the importance of gratitude. 	<p>Key Content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Hud (AS) was sent to the people of 'Ad, who were strong and proud but disobedient. Quranic reference: <i>"And to 'Ad [We sent] their brother Hud. He said, 'O my people, worship Allah; you have no deity other than Him.'"</i> (Quran 11:50) Hud (AS) warned them that their pride and refusal to worship Allah would lead to destruction. Quranic reference: <i>"So remember the favours of Allah that you might succeed."</i> (Quran 7:69)
Saalih AS	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Learn about Prophet Salih (AS) and the people of Thamud. Understand Salih's miracles, particularly the story of the she-camel. Reflect on the importance of respecting Allah's signs and following His guidance. 	<p>Key Content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Salih (AS) was sent to the people of Thamud, who were skilled builders but disobedient. Quranic reference: <i>"And to Thamud [We sent] their brother Salih. He said, 'O my people, worship Allah; you have no deity other than Him.'"</i> (Quran 11:61)

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Allah sent a she-camel as a miracle and a test for the people of Thamud. Quranic reference: <i>"This is the she-camel of Allah [sent] to you as a sign. So let her feed upon Allah's earth, and do not touch her with harm, lest you be seized by an impending punishment."</i> (Quran 7:73)
Ibrahim AS 1	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Learn about Prophet Ibrahim's (AS) journey to discovering the oneness of Allah. Understand how he questioned the worship of celestial bodies and rejected false gods. Reflect on using reason and observation to find and follow the truth. 	<p>Key Content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ibrahim (AS) observed the stars, moon, and sun and realized they could not be gods. Quranic reference: "Indeed, I have turned my face toward He who created the heavens and the earth, inclining toward truth..." (Quran 6:79) He proclaimed belief in the one true God, Allah, despite his community's opposition.
Ibrahim/Ismail/Is haq AS 2	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Learn about Ibrahim's (AS) bold stand against idol worship. Understand how he challenged his people's beliefs by breaking the idols. Reflect on the importance of courage and devotion to tawheed. 	<p>Key Content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ibrahim (AS) destroyed the idols in the temple, leaving only the largest one. Quranic reference: "He said, 'Rather, this – the largest of them – did it, so ask them, if they should [be able to] speak.'" (Quran 21:63) His actions exposed the falsehood of idol worship and called his people to Allah.
Ibrahim/Ismail/Is haq AS 3	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Learn about the sacred task of building the Kaaba by Ibrahim and Ismail (AS). Understand the importance of intention, du'a, and submitting to Allah's plan. Reflect on the legacy of righteous actions done for the sake of Allah. 	<p>Key Content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ibrahim and Ismail (AS) raised the foundations of the Kaaba and made sincere du'a. Quranic reference: "And [mention] when Ibrahim was raising the foundations of the House and [with him] Ismail, [saying], 'Our Lord, accept [this] from us...'" (Quran 2:127) Their effort established a center of worship for future generations.
Ibrahim/Ismail/Is haq AS 4	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p>	<p>Key Content:</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Learn about the test of sacrifice given to Ibrahim (AS) through a divine dream. Understand the obedience and trust shown by both father and son. Reflect on submission to Allah's will and the reward of sincerity. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ibrahim (AS) told Ismail (AS) about his dream and was ready to sacrifice him. Quranic reference: "O my son, indeed I have seen in a dream that I [must] sacrifice you..." (Quran 37:102) Allah replaced Ismail with a ram, rewarding their trust and obedience.
Ibrahim/Ismail/Ishaq AS 5	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Learn about the birth and role of Ishaq (AS) in continuing the message of tawheed. Understand the blessings of patience and the fulfillment of Allah's promises. Reflect on how prophethood was preserved through righteous offspring. 	<p>Key Content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ishaq (AS) was born to Ibrahim and Sarah in their old age as a gift from Allah. Quranic reference: "And We gave him good tidings of Isaac, a prophet from among the righteous." (Quran 37:112) He was part of the prophetic lineage and carried on the message of guidance.
Lut AS	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Learn about the mission of Prophet Lut (AS) to the people of Sodom. Understand the severe moral corruption of his people and his efforts to guide them. Reflect on the importance of upholding morality and the consequences of persistent disobedience. 	<p>Key Content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Lut (AS) warned his people against their sinful behavior and called them to purity and righteousness. Quranic reference: "Indeed, you approach men with desire, instead of women. Rather, you are a transgressing people." (Quran 7:81) Despite his warnings, they rejected him, and Allah punished them for their evil deeds.
Yaqub AS	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Learn about Yaqub's (AS) role as a prophet and father of many prophets. Understand his deep sorrow over the loss of Yusuf (AS) and his unwavering patience. Reflect on trusting Allah even in times of long-term hardship and grief. 	<p>Key Content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Yaqub (AS) endured the separation from his son Yusuf (AS) with sabr and hope in Allah. Quranic reference: "So patience is most fitting. And Allah is the one sought for help against that which you describe." (Quran 12:18) His story teaches us that patience brings reward and relief from Allah.
Shuayb AS	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p>	<p>Key Content:</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn about Shuayb's (AS) message to the people of Madyan. • Understand the importance of fair dealing, honest trade, and economic justice. • Reflect on the connection between faith and ethical behavior in business. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Shuayb (AS) called his people to worship Allah and to stop cheating in trade. • Quranic reference: "Give full measure and weight, and do not deprive people of their due..." (Quran 7:85) • His people ignored the warnings and were destroyed for their dishonesty and corruption.
Ayyub AS	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn about the severe trials faced by Prophet Ayyub (AS) in health, wealth, and family. • Understand his unwavering patience and continuous praise of Allah during hardship. • Reflect on trusting Allah's wisdom and mercy in times of personal difficulty. 	<p>Key Content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ayyub (AS) suffered great loss but never complained, and remained devoted to Allah. • Quranic reference: "Indeed, We found him patient. An excellent servant! Indeed, he was one repeatedly turning back [to Allah]." (Quran 38:44) • Allah eventually restored all that he lost and honored him for his perseverance.
Dhul-Kifl AS	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn about the character and role of Prophet Dhul-Kifl (AS). • Understand his patience, sense of justice, and dedication to Allah. • Reflect on being steadfast in responsibilities and staying righteous in difficult times. 	<p>Key Content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dhul-Kifl (AS) is praised in the Quran for his patience and righteousness. • Quranic reference: "And [mention] Ishmael, Idrees and Dhul-Kifl; all were of the patient." (Quran 21:85) • Though little detail is known, his example encourages fulfilling duties with integrity.
Musa/Harun AS	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn about the mission of Musa (AS) and Harun (AS) to confront the oppression of Pharaoh. • Understand their call for justice, freedom for the Israelites, and belief in Allah. • Reflect on courage, reliance on Allah, and speaking truth to power. 	<p>Key Content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Musa (AS) was sent to Pharaoh with signs and was supported by his brother Harun (AS). • Quranic reference: "Go, both of you, to Pharaoh. Indeed, he has transgressed." (Quran 20:43) • Their story shows how faith can overcome tyranny and arrogance.

Dawud AS	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn about Dawud's (AS) role as both a prophet and king. • Understand his fairness, worship, and ability to judge between people with justice. • Reflect on using power with humility and ruling or leading with fairness. 	<p>Key Content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dawud (AS) was given wisdom, the Psalms (Zabur), and a beautiful voice. • Quranic reference: "O Dawud, indeed We have made you a successor upon the earth, so judge between the people in truth..." (Quran 38:26) • He is a model of piety and balance between spiritual and worldly leadership.
Sulaiman AS	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn about the unique blessings given to Prophet Sulaiman (AS), including control over jinn, animals, and the wind. • Understand the importance of gratitude and humility even with great power. • Reflect on using gifts from Allah to serve others and do good. 	<p>Key Content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sulaiman (AS) thanked Allah for the ability to understand animals and lead wisely. • Quranic reference: "He said, 'My Lord, enable me to be grateful for Your favor which You have bestowed upon me...'" (Quran 27:19) • His story shows that true strength comes with humility and worship.
Ilyas AS	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn about Ilyas's (AS) mission to guide the people away from idol worship. • Understand his firm stand against Baal worship and the rejection he faced. • Reflect on standing for truth even when alone and holding firm to faith. 	<p>Key Content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ilyas (AS) reminded his people of Allah's blessings and warned them against idols. • Quranic reference: "Will you call upon Baal and leave the best of creators – Allah, your Lord and the Lord of your first forefathers?" (Quran 37:125–126) • His story highlights dedication to da'wah and reliance on Allah.
Alyasa AS	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn about Alyasa's (AS) role in continuing the prophetic mission after Ilyas (AS). • Understand that prophets were sent one after another to guide people back to Allah. • Reflect on staying committed to guidance and living righteously. 	<p>Key Content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Alyasa (AS) is mentioned alongside other noble prophets for his steadfastness. • Quranic reference: "And remember Ishmael, Elisha, and Dhul-Kifl, and all are among the outstanding." (Quran 38:48) • Though little is detailed, his inclusion among the greats teaches the value of sincerity and perseverance.

Yunus AS	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn about Yunus's (AS) story of leaving his people and being swallowed by the big fish. • Understand that mistakes can be made, but sincere repentance is always accepted. • Reflect on humility, patience, and the mercy of Allah. 	<p>Key Content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Yunus (AS) called out to Allah from within the belly of the fish with a powerful du'a. • Quranic reference: "There is no deity except You; exalted are You. Indeed, I have been of the wrongdoers." (Quran 21:87) • Allah forgave him and saved him, showing His mercy to those who repent.
Zakariya AS	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn about Zakariya's (AS) heartfelt du'a for a righteous child in old age. • Understand that Allah responds to sincere prayers, no matter the circumstances. • Reflect on the importance of never losing hope in Allah's mercy. 	<p>Key Content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Zakariya (AS) prayed for a child to carry on the message of Allah. • Quranic reference: "My Lord, grant me from Yourself a good offspring. Indeed, You are the Hearer of supplication." (Quran 3:38) • Allah blessed him with Yahya (AS), showing that nothing is impossible for Allah.
Yahya AS	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn about Yahya's (AS) character as a pure, obedient, and wise child. • Understand that Allah can guide and bless even the young with strong faith. • Reflect on sincerity, humility, and living a life of worship and truth. 	<p>Key Content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Yahya (AS) was given wisdom and compassion as a child and lived a life of righteousness. • Quranic reference: "O Yahya, take the Scripture with determination." And We gave him judgment [while yet] a boy. (Quran 19:12) • He was a noble prophet who embodied moral integrity and fear of Allah.
Isa AS	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn about the miraculous birth of Isa (AS) and his signs from childhood. • Understand his role as a prophet and servant of Allah, not divine. • Reflect on belief in miracles and the power of Allah over all things. 	<p>Key Content:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Isa (AS) spoke as a baby and defended his mother Maryam (AS). • Quranic reference: "Indeed, I am the servant of Allah. He has given me the Scripture and made me a prophet." (Quran 19:30) • His early life showed clear signs that he was chosen by Allah for a great mission.
Isa AS	<p>Objectives and Lessons:</p>	<p>Key Content:</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn about Isa's (AS) teachings, miracles, and his mission to guide Bani Isra'il. • Understand that he was not crucified but raised by Allah and will return before the end of time. • Reflect on obeying prophetic teachings and believing in the unseen. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Isa (AS) healed the sick, raised the dead by Allah's permission, and called people to worship Allah. • Quranic reference: "And [I have come] confirming what was before me of the Torah and to make lawful for you some of what was forbidden to you." (Quran 3:50) • He will return to restore justice and truth, as foretold in authentic hadith.
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
